

## Who Is NAKASEC

The National Korean American Service & Education Consortium (NAKASEC) was founded in 1994 by local community centers seeking to empower and improve the lives of Korean Americans as a part of a greater goal of building a national movement for social change. They are the Korean Resource Center (KRC) in Los Angeles, Korean American Resource & Cultural Center (KRCC) in Chicago and YKASEC – Empowering the Korean American Community (YKASEC) in New York.

NAKASEC and its affiliates form a strong and unique network that forwards a holistic empowerment model. Our affiliates provide programs in education, social services, culture, civic engagement and organizing that address the full human & political needs of community members. NAKASEC develops sound and informed policy advocacy goals, produces relevant educational products and coordinates results oriented national grassroots campaigns that are informed by its participation in national strategy formations and directed by the leadership of our affiliates.

Since the 1980s, NAKASEC and its affiliates have been providing social services to their constituents. Social services provided include but are not limited to low-income tax clinics, credit education clinics, legal services clinics, naturalization clinics, and translation and interpretation services. In 2006 and 2007, as of June 15, the affiliates provided social services to 12,200 and 5,000 community members, respectively. Other programs provided throughout the year are the health access programs assisting youth and seniors, civic participation programs, and youth leadership groups.

NAKASEC's and the affiliates' activities and accomplishments are documented on a regular basis through media coverage in newspapers and on radio and television. The work of all 4 organizations garners media attention from respected outlets in each city and receives hundreds of media hits from local, national, and ethnic media each year.

NAKASEC has and continues to make great strides for civil and human rights for all minority and disadvantaged communities, so that everyone may someday enjoy equal rights in America.
